Important Information for Emmaus Men's Walk 1485 February 26- March 1, 2009 McKinney Roughs

McKinney Roughs is located on Highway 71 East, approximately 13 miles on the other side of Austin Bergstrom Airport and is immediately adjacent to the Hyatt Regency Lost Pines Resort. This will be the first time the Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group has used McKinney Roughs for a Walk, and there are some significant differences between Highland Lakes and this site.

McKinney Roughs has a large dining hall and a "chef's dream" commercial kitchen; however, there is no kitchen staff. Yet God does provide. Within our 4th Day Community, a Men's Reunion Group, which includes several chefs, has volunteered to be present on site for the entire Walk and to prepare each of our meals. Indeed this is "manna" from heaven and an amazing gift of agape!

Sleeping accommodations will be Bunk House Style. McKinney Roughs has 3 two story dorms with ample shower and restroom facilities on each floor. The servant team, the lay/clergy team and the pilgrims will each use one of the dorms. Transportation restrictions at McKinney Roughs do not permit the use of golf carts on campus. However, this restriction does not extend to wheel chairs or individual motorized "scooters." Also, private automobiles cannot pull up next to the dorms for unloading pilgrims. Although the distance between the various facilities (dorms, chapel, conference room and dining hall) is not great; one needs to be aware of these limitations. If any sponsor or pilgrim has further questions, please contact one of the individuals below.

Twenty Pilgrims must be registered with SWTC by January 22, 2009 to avoid cancellation of Walk 1485. This date is two weeks earlier than most Walks. McKinney Rough contract provisions with SWTC require event confirmation by this date in view of the high demand for use of its facilities. Cancellation within 32 days prior to Walk 1485 would incur significant financial penalties.

McKinney Roughs is a beautiful 1,100 acre nature site with a campus that is well suited for an Emmaus Walk. For more information regarding the site, one is encouraged to "google" LCRA McKinney Roughs Nature Park. 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Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group Board of Directors Meeting

The Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group Board of Directors met on Thursday, December 4, 2008 at Riverbend Church. In Attendance were: Rev. Georgia Stone, Spiritual Director, Bud Broeker, SWTC Board Representative; Jack Foreman, Member Services; Diane Merwarth, Walk Support; Gene McConnell, Gathering Support; Mike Rhodes, Treasurer and Cortney Smith, Chrysalis.

Bud Broeker called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. and the meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Stone. The minutes from the November 6, 2008 meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: The General Fund balance on November 30, 2008 was \$3,189.20 with \$138 due for distribution. The Scholarship Fund balance was \$804.73. The treasurer's report was approved.

Mike Rhodes suggested that the General Fund and Scholarship Fund be combined to avoid the fee that is charged by the bank for the second account. The motion was approved.

Bud Broeker proposed the following dates for future Walks:

Men's Walk – February 25-28, 2010 Women's Walk – April 25-28, 2010 Men's Walk – October 7-10, 2010

Women's Walk - November 11-15, 2010

The dates were approved and prepared for mailing to the SWTX Conference office.

Gene McConnell stated that host churches have been secured for the next six months for Gatherings, though no speakers have been confirmed. It was discussed that the Gatherings for January and June of 2009 would be held on the 2nd Tuesday of the month.

Diane Merwarth discussed the babysitting options for the Men's Walk to be held at McKinney Roughs. She will confirm with the facility whether or not space for babysitting will be available and if not, it will be publicized that no babysitting is available for candlelight.

There was discussion about reserving luminaries for Teddy Broeker's Walk. Bud Broker will make the reservation.

There was a discussion of the use of targeted communications to reach Pilgrims in their 4th Day. It was discussed whether or not Pilgrim's e-mail addresses listed at registration should be used for community updates and information. It was suggested that an opt-out option could be included in e-mail correspondences. It was discussed that the Board should explore alternatives to the current Yahoo group that is being used for communication since there has been problems getting people signed up and that a Yahoo account is needed to join the group.

Team selection was set for February 12th for the next two Walks. The meeting was adjourned at 6:50 P.M. with a closing prayer by Rev. Stone.

MINUTES: Minutes were read. Minutes approved and seconded. Motion carried.

TREASURERS REPORT: Treasurer reports balance of \$6,765.27. We will check on the second check received from Conference as reimbursement, we need to follow up as to if we owe or conference does. Treasurers report was approved and it was seconded by. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Boys Journey - Found the a couple who will do the marriage talk. We are still looking for a Singles Talk. Darren will focus on 4 tables. They will have there 2nd team meeting on Saturday, November 22. There is 1 butterfly signed up. 1 scholarship as been requested. *With regards to scholarships, we discussed how many to offer and shouldn't the butterfly take some ownership by paying a portion. We decided to bring up each scholarship as it comes up individually.

Prayers for the Singles talk, butterflies and sponsors.

Girls Journey – The second meeting has taken place. The marriage talk was filled today. Still have 8 talks to preview at the last meeting due to unforeseen circumstances at the last meeting. One of the clergy talks will be previewed the evening before the flights. It was suggested that the talk be emailed ahead of time to team to preview. December 6 is the last team meeting.

Shirts: They will be long sleeve and we will ask \$15, the money earned will go to scholarships. We need to order more than last time. There was discussion as to whether we need to change the amount the shirts are sold for.

Girls Chrysalis: Again looking at places to host the Chrysalis. It was suggested that 1st Methodist in downtown Austin, or Marble Falls. If the churches are used the flights would be Wed – Sat, and if we use Twin Oaks it will be Thurs – Sun. We have Twin Oaks booked but the Conference price may be too high. We will follow up on this. Need to get a SD confirmed. It was suggested that Sheri Clifton might be a possibility and she will be contacted. Sandy Brooks agreed to be the Board Rep. Need to find an outside coordinator. These three positions need to be turned into Conference ASAP.

Boy Chrysalis: No LD has been found. We will wait until the December meeting to try to locate a Boys LD and then if no one is available we will concentrate on 2010.

The Flight dates for 2010 will be the same as 2009. Looking forward to possibly LD's for 2010. We will also work on the 2011 Journey's.

Hoot: We are changing the date of the Hoot from January 24 to Sat, January 31. There are several youth that will be attending Mid-Winter retreats on the 24th. We will try to have the location be at 1st UMC in downtown Austin. We need to locate speakers, a good speaker may be someone from one of the Journey's. Tracy and Taylor need to work on the publicity.

Publicity: We need to talk to youth directors for the summer Chrysalis to work on getting butterflies and church involvement. Also need to look for possible older youth that have been on Chrysalis to talk about their experiences on Chrysalis.
