Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group Board of Directors Meeting

The Greater Austin Emmaus 4th Day Group Board of Directors met on Thursday, October 1, 2009, at Oak Hill UMC Church. In Attendance were: Jack Foreman, Lay Director; Gene McConnell, Assistant Lay Director; Bud Broeker, SWTC Board Representative; Diane Merwarth, Walk Support; Roxie Greenway; Treasurer, Cortney Smith, Chrysalis Representative; Bob Duplantis, Member Services Support; Sandy Brooks, Gathering Support; Rev. Georgia Stone, Spiritual Director and Leslie Smith, past Lay Director.

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm by Lay Director Jack Foreman, with an opening Prayer by Roxie Greenway. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved on a motion by Bob Duplantis, with a second by Bud Broeker.

The finance report was presented by Roxie Greenway and approved on a motion by Bud Broeker, seconded by Bob Duplantis. Roxie reported that as of the end of September, the overall total balance of funds is at \$8,684.91. This is before refunding any fees back to team members of walk 1513. Roxie reported that she had already written numerous \$65.00 checks for scholarships for the upcoming walk 1530, as she thought she had authority to do that without board approval. She will send the board the names she wrote scholarship checks for and ask for board approval by e-mail. The results of that e-mail voting approval are that all scholarship checks written were approved by a unanimous vote of yes from all board members by e-mail. A motion was made by Bud Broeker and seconded by Bob Duplantis to offer scholarships of ½2 pilgrim costs for any more pilgrims needing help to go on walk 1530. The motion passed.

Old Business:

Bud Broeker reported there was nothing new to report from conference.

Diane Merwarth reported that there was nothing new to report concerning childcare requirements.

Gene McConnell reported that host churches with 4th day speakers and music have been set for the rest of 2009 and that duties for securing host churches for 2010 have been turned over to Sandy Brooks, the new Gathering Support board member.

New Business:

There was an update of the transition of walk 1513 team for walk 1541 in February. It appears they plan to have 2 team meetings as they will have 3 new team members and 4 new talks to be reviewed. A motion was made by Bob Duplantis and seconded by Roxie Greenway for Bud Broeker to let the Lay Director, Keith Bible know the Board recommends they have two meetings, they hear the 4 new talks and hear a 5 minute synopsis of the other talks already given in past meetings. The motion passed.

The date of the next LLDO was confirmed for 10/03/09 with Bud Broeker, Jack Foreman and Sandy Brooks indicating they planned to attend.

The board decided to hold a special board meeting within the next two weeks to discuss what recommendations the board wants to make to conference concerning the Highland Lakes contract proposed for 2010 walks and also to discuss how to re-energize the Greater Austin Emmaus Community. The actual date will be decided by polling board members by e-mail to find the best date for everyone.

Jack Foreman requested \$200 be approved for ordering Emmaus marketing materials to be distributed to churches throughout GAE4DG. The motion was made by Bob Duplantis, seconded by Diane Merwarth and passed to use \$200 for purchasing Emmaus pamphlets for distribution.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00PM with a closing prayer by Rev Georgia Stone. Minutes submitted by: Gene McConnell, Assistant Lay Director
